Data Snapshots: Populations In Need

Population: Persons Experiencing Homelessness¹

Point-in-Time Count

- According to 2015 Jacksonville-Duval County Point-in-Time (PIT) count data, 1,853 total homeless persons were identified.
- According to 2015 PIT data, 426 homeless individuals (23% of the total homeless population) are unsheltered on any given night in Jacksonville-Duval and Clay counties.

Substance Abuse and Mental Illness

- Of those counted during the 2015 count, 636 homeless individuals (34% of the local homeless population) were reported as having chronic substance abuse.
- 443 homeless individuals (24% of the local homeless population) were reported as having severe mental illness.

Veteran Homelessness

- 184 homeless veterans were counted during the 2015 PIT count, 56 of whom were unsheltered.
- As a whole, veterans made up 10% of the homeless population in Jacksonville-Duval and Clay counties in 2015.

Chronic Homelessness

- Throughout the CoC, there were 353 chronically homeless persons counted during the 2015 PIT count.
- Chronically homeless persons made up 19.0% of the homeless population in the CoC, higher than the 2015 national average of 15.8%.

HIV/AIDS

- In 2015, there were 24 individuals with HIV/AIDS experiencing homelessness in Jacksonville-Duval and Clay counties.
- In 2014, Jacksonville ranked third in the nation in HIV/AIDS rates with an HIV/AIDS rate of 29.1 per 100,000 people and 7,292 cumulative cases.

Unemployment

- Jacksonville's seasonally adjusted December 2015 unemployment rate was 4.5%, lower than Florida's unemployment rate of 5.0% at the same time. The national rate in December was 5.0%.

Rent and the Minimum Wage

- In Jacksonville, the housing wage is \$17.90 per hour; in Florida it is \$19.47 per hour. "Housing wage" is the hourly wage needed to afford a two-bedroom apartment at Fair Market Rent without paying more than 30% of income on housing. It assumes a 40-hour work week, 52 weeks per year.
- Minimum wage in Florida is \$8.05.

Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program Clients in Florida in 2011 by Housing Status

- Stable/Permanent Housing: 40,133 (90.7%)
- Temporary Housing: 2,788 (6.3%)
- Unstable Housing: 1,303 (2.9%)
- Note: Housing status was not reported for 4,412 clients

Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program Clients in Florida in 2011 by Household Income as % of FPL

- Equal to or Below FPL – 28,975 (63%)
- Between 101-200% of FPL – 11,933 (26%)
- Note: Household income was not reported for 2,651 clients.



Percent of Patients with HIV: 1.1





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
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Jacksonville Health Center Profiles (2014)
