Funding Availability: The Office of Adolescent Health (OAH) released five funding opportunities for the FY 2015 Teen Pregnancy Prevention program. One, *Capacity Building to Support Replications of Evidence-Based TPP programs*, will provide preference points for applicants who propose to work in a Promise Zone.

Eligible Applicants: Public and Private Institutions

Application deadlines: Applications due April 1, 2015.

Benefits to Promise Zone: Preference Points

Program Description: The Teen Pregnancy Prevention program addresses rising teen pregnancy rates by supporting grantees in replicating evidence-based models and implementing demonstration programs to develop and test additional models and innovative strategies.

OAH provides training materials and resources for Teen pregnancy Prevention grantees and other organizations working to reduce teen pregnancy in the United States. It offers E-Learning modules, podcasts, webinars, and training materials.

One of OAH's Funding Opportunity Announcements (FOAs), *Capacity Building to Support Replication in Evidence-Based TPP Programs*, is intended to fund intermediary organizations to replicate evidence-based TPP services in a defined service area with demonstrated need. OAH also released four other FOAs, in which applicants must propose to work in any community or population with demonstrated need for teen pregnancy prevention, which may include Promise Zones.
