Benefit Type: Grant Competition

Eligible Applicants: Any Indian tribe, band, group, or nation (including Alaska Indians, Aleut, and Eskimos) or Alaska Native village which has established a relationship to the Federal government as defined in the program regulations. In certain instances, tribal organizations may be eligible to apply.

Funding Availability: HUD is making \$56,611,911 available through this NOFA for Single Purpose grants. In FY16, approximately \$60,000,000 was appropriated for the ICDBG program. Of that amount, up to \$4,000,000 was retained to fund Imminent Threat grants to alleviate or remove threats to health or safety that require an immediate solution.

Benefits to Promise Zone: Bonus Points (2 pts) will be awarded to projects where the majority of work will occur in a designated Promise Zone.

Program Description: The ICDBG Program provides eligible grantees with direct grants for use in developing viable Indian and Alaska Native Communities. The program is administered by the six area ONAPs with policy development and oversight provided by the Denver National Program Office of ONAP.

The purpose of the ICDBG program is to develop viable Indian and Alaska Native communities, including decent housing, suitable living environments, and economic opportunities, primarily for moderately low and low income persons.

Application Deadline: June 14, 2016
