

The CoC Program regulations define the responsibilities of CoCs. One of these responsibilities is conducting the PIT count. CoCs should engage the Veterans Administration, runaway and homeless youth providers, local education liaisons, relevant homeless and mainstream service providers, local law enforcement, and other community partners such as universities in the PIT count planning and implementation process. The success of a PIT count often depends on the CoC's efforts to include relevant stakeholders in the PIT count planning and implementation process. The topic of recruiting partner organizations is covered in more detail in Section 3.

In addition, HUD requires Con Plan jurisdictions, which are city, county, and state government agencies that received HUD's formula grants, like CDBG, to collaborate with and use data from the CoC's PIT counts within their geographic areas.
